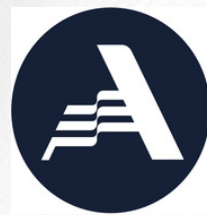

SENIORS VOLUNTEERING FOR SENIORS (SVS)

Transportation

- Older adults drive other older adults to essential locations, like the doctor's office, pharmacy, grocery store, bank and basic need appointments free of charge.

Friendly Visitor & Phone Assurance

- Home visits & phone calls to offer wellness checks and connection to community.
- Providing socialization and preventing loneliness & isolation.

Handy Person Program

- Handy seniors provide minor home maintenance & repairs to their senior neighbors.

INTERGENERATIONAL

America Reads

- Ensuring all students are able to read at grade level by the end of 3rd grade.

Beginning Alcohol & Addictions Basic Education Studies (BABES)

- Education for elementary students related to substance abuse/prevention, coping skills, bullying, & peer pressure.

Foster Grandparent Program (FGP)

- Income eligible volunteers provide tutoring to elementary students in literacy & math.

COMMUNITY

Volunteers are offered opportunities county wide at numerous partner agencies:

- Food pantries, homeless & domestic violence shelters, senior centers, healthcare facilities, nursing homes, meal programs, libraries, museums, schools & more!
- Hats, scarves, mittens, blankets & other goods are made & donated to local groups.
- Folk Fairs provide students education about different cultures & heritages.

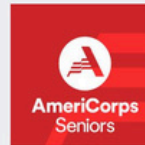
